Pastoral Letter from David Collins, Reader in the Bradgate Team Love Life, Live Lent

Recently there have been a couple of reports in the Leicester Mercury about people who have been given £20 by complete strangers. Not life changing sums of money I know, but these random acts of kindness have produced feelings of well being vastly out of proportion to the original act.

Love Life, Live Lent is a scheme which began in Birmingham in 2006. It offers a new and different way of keeping Lent whereby children and adults are offered opportunities to make a difference to someone's life every day for the forty days of Lent. The Independent newspaper said this in 2007:

"In recent years, in different corners of the globe, several movements have sprung up inviting followers to combat the selfishness of modern life by doing nice things to random strangers. If you put your mind to it, carrying out acts of kindness can start as soon as you wake up. You can be kind to people in different parts of the country, or on the other side of the world, or even be kind to the planet itself, without leaving your home."



From the Records

Copy from the Leicester Mercury

Through the years the LEICESTER MERCURY has provided copy for the Village (WI) Records. A subject often raised is Bradgate Park. September 1977 provided some interesting news. The County Land Agent Mr Edward Turner retired after 29 years. The article told us that he had been the Ranger of Bradgate Park for 16 years. He was succeeded by Mr Michael Harrison Chief Assistant Land Agent. On the same page there is an article about Mr George Grass. A forester by trade who was Head Warden of Leicestershire County Council's

by trade who was Head Warden of Leicestershire County Council's Country Parks. By 1977 he had been Head Keeper at Bradgate Park for 16 years. "His simple aim was to do the job to the best of his ability" Mr Grass explained about the herds of wild red and fallow deer.

There have been deer in the Park since at least 1220 but little was done to monitor them until 1962 when Mr Grass and the new Ranger, replacing retired staff, began tagging young deer. Ever since then, for a three week period in June, Mr Grass and his men search the 800 acres at night to find the new born deer. The combined herd which varies from 280—320, has steadily improved in quality.

In 1962 Ministry of Agriculture Veterinary Surgeons carried out a research project on the red deer to find out the cause of a disease known as SWAYBACK, which was prevalent in herds throughout the country. It was discovered to be copper deficiency and it is now possible to control the disease.

In his interview Mr Grass talked of the spectacle of deer giving birth and the gentle licking down by the mother, a sight that never failed to engross him. The natural way of things is all-important to Mr Grass's way of life but often it can be cruel. The rutting or mating season for example, sees stags fighting, in some cases to the death, for the rights of a harem. Once they have established their rights the stag spends three weeks serving the females and tirelessly keeping rivals at bay, at which time they can loose half of their body weight.

Mr Grass said "the problem with the deer is that they are wild. We do not interfere unless it is anything serious. They are very difficult animals to keep. Its nice to be able to let the public get so near to them in their wild state. THE WORST PROBLEM WE HAVE IS DOGS CHASING THEM"

The precept is the money which is spent on street lighting, insurance, repairs and maintenance, wages, hanging basket plants and their maintenance, the Christmas tree in the school yard, contribution towards the cost of the Bob Bown Memorial Field, donations to local organisations, grounds maintenance for the churchyard, the cemetery and the playing field, administration, audit fees, subscriptions to organisations which help the Parish Council and much more. Residents can view the books prior and after the external auditors check them. The dates will be on the village noticeboards. Thanks to careful budgeting and even more careful spending, the Parish Council has been able to keep the precept at £38,000 for the fourth year. If the Council Tax goes up this year it will not be due to the Parish precept.
