enerational differences can be quite something. Particularly over the past century, when the pace of change has probably been quicker than at any time in recorded history. Not long ago, I was at a farming museum and gazing at a particularly rusty specimen of a tractor. I realised it was the model my dad used occasionally when allowed to drive on the farm he grew up on back in the 1950s. You'd never see the like of it at work today – no seatbelt for one thing – but for his dad, my grandad, it was still an advanced bit of technology. He'd spent most of his farming life with a horse doing the ploughing.

Whereas my son, all 16 months old, seems more motivated in learning to speak so that Siri or Alexa understand him better than we do! His current favourite pastime is pressing the button on the bottom of the iPad and seeing if he can get Siri to say 'hello' back to his muttered 'lo'.

These differences can easily lead to misunderstanding and even deepen into suspicion. I can't imagine what it was like milking the cows before heading off to school, and my dad didn't really ever fully understand the pressures of teenage life in the 1980s and the emergence of computers as a major influence. Every teenage generation has said 'you just don't understand', and every generation as it has aged has said something along the lines of 'it was never like this in my day...'.

Yet some of the richest interactions we have are with people from another generation – my wife still values immensely the hours she spent with her grandmother learning to sew and crochet. When we divide ourselves by age, we miss out on insight, wisdom and challenge.

The Church inherited inter-generationality (please let me know if there's a better word for it than that!) from its Jewish roots, where there is a rich heritage of family-based rituals and celebrations where young and old alike have a part to play in asking and answering questions. The Church is still one of the few places where you will see 9-month-olds and 90-year-olds engaging in the same event. In a society where misunder-standing is rife, and suspicion on the rise, we need to strengthen those links between the generations, to bring reconciliation and understanding instead of division. To learn to get along and share rather than go our separate ways.

Laying up of the Guidon

On Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> May a special service will take place at All Saints' in which the Guidon of the Leicestershire and Derbyshire Yeomanry will be laid up.

The Guidon is the cavalry equivalent of a battle Standard – it has a distinctive triangular shape to distinguish it from a (square) Standard – and it performed the same task. Originally a way of identifying location on the battlefield, it developed into a way to display the battle honours of the regiment or squadron on parade. Every so often a new Guidon is issued and presented by a member of the Royal Family and the old one must be 'laid up', consecrated and placed beyond use, hanging in a chapel or church or other public building until it disintegrates due to age.

A new Guidon was given to the Yeomanry some years ago, the old one has since been hanging temporarily in the mess at their barracks in Wigston. On Saturday 14th it will be handed over to All Saints', where it will be hung permanently in the north transept, a reminder of the strong ongoing link of the Church with the Yeoman, through the hosting of the annual Frezenberg Memorial service in mid-May, which will also be incorporated into this event. 




## **Newtown Linford Gardening Club**

#### Information from David Snartt.

## Planning Matters.

I was pleased to see residents from the village have had their say during the consultation, objecting to the proposed developments adjacent to Bradgate Road, Anstey, making it clear the negative impact this will have on village life. I have also written to the Local Highway Authority asking them to take all of the development in Anstey together when making decisions on highway matters. In my view, 920 extra dwellings will make an enormous difference to the already severe levels of traffic we see at peak times of the day. I have also alerted our MP Edward Argar about my concerns. If you would still like to have your say on these planning applications,

e-mail <u>development.control@charnwood.gov.uk</u> including the application numbers P/21/2358/2 and P/21/2359/2.

Residents living on Markfield Lane near to Field Head have received a leaflet about possible development at the rear of the houses on the left hand side going towards Field Head. This land was put forward to Charnwood Borough Council to be included in the Strategic Housing and Economic Land Availability Assessment (SHELAA). This land has not been included in the Charnwood Draft Local Plan which is now in the examination stage of the process. Details of the Draft Local Plan can be found on the Council's website.

I now understand, following the publication of the pre-submission Charnwood Draft Local Plan, the Council received representations from Pegasus Group on behalf of clients regarding land in this area. These representations have been submitted to the Planning Inspectorate and may be considered by the Inspectors during the examination in public. This information can be found by going to

https://www.charnwood.gov.uk/pages/lp representations,

these representations are 619 and 622.

I have put my name forward to speak at the hearings which should be taking place during June/July.

## **Update on Council Tax Rebate.**

Council Tax rebates to help with energy bills will start to be paid to Charnwood residents.

Charnwood Borough Council will confirm details soon about how residents who do not pay their council tax by Direct Debit will receive their payment. Residents are urged to keep an eye on the Council's council tax rebate webpage, which is regularly updated. For those who receive Housing Benefit, Universal Credit or Council Tax Support, the rebate will not affect your entitlement to these benefits.

The Council will also be launching a discretionary scheme for vulnerable households who may not qualify for council tax rebate. Further details will be announced shortly. If you are unsure on which council tax band you are in, you can find out by visiting My Charnwood. To find more details on the council tax rebate, visit the webpage where there is further information and frequently asked questions.

## Need a Dog Boarder?

I have received this information from Charnwood Borough Council. Going on holiday or returning to work? If you are having to leave your dog whilst at work or overnight, please make sure you use a licensed boarder. Anyone who carries out a business of boarding dogs in Charnwood must have a licence from Charnwood Borough Council. Therefore if you are paying someone to look after a dog then they need to be licensed. Licensed dog boarders are assessed against minimum standards and the majority also comply with optional higher standards to ensure the welfare of your dog. #### **Outwoods Visitor Centre and Café.**

I attended an event at the Outwoods to unveil a plaque dedicating the Outwoods Visitor Centre and Café in memory of David Slater, former leader of Charnwood Borough Council. David was a good friend and col-

league at the Council. Therefore, I believe this was a fitting tribute to recognise his achievements whilst Leader of the Council.

Last year, the Council invested in this project to convert the former ranger's cottage into a visitor centre and café. The café is being operated by popular Loughborough business Olivia's Coffee and Bakery which will be known to many local residents. I know by talking to people this café has already become a place to visit whilst enjoying one of the oldest surviving woodland sites in Charnwood. It will soon be time again to visit the Outwoods to see the wonderful display of bluebells in this 110 acres of ancient woodland.

#### From the Park

With the sun shining and a busy Easter weekend in full flow, this month I'm pleased to be able to write about some recently completed work and exciting projects in the pipeline here at Bradgate.

When I last wrote, the café at the Deer Barns was about to close for major works — it has now been fully refurbished and the previously cramped space has been transformed into one big light, airy room with new counters, flooring and furniture — we hope this will give visitors a far more pleasant experience when enjoying their café visit. Do come and see for yourself if you haven't done so yet — and I can thoroughly recommend the flapjack!



Meanwhile, at the top of the hill, the woodland at Hunt's Hill is being transformed into an area for Forest Schools and two of our Rangers are being trained to lead these sessions in the future – huge thanks to Severn Trent Community Fund for supporting this.

We've also recently been planning some work to resurface a couple of key routes across the park with locally sourced stone / gravel – I hope some of you will have come to chat to us or seen the display in the Visitor Centre over Easter. The impact assessment work we've commissioned shows the benefits of this resurfacing to the park and landscape, particularly in areas where new desire lines have formed or existing routes have become wider and wider, potentially damaging wildlife habitats. Our next steps will be to discuss this work with planners at Charnwood.

At the Hallgates end of the park, new fencing has gone up around the overflow car park and tree frames in the adjacent field – these are the first steps in creating field margins for wildlife habitats and planting new hedgerows and parkland trees there next winter.

Finally, look out for some new information boards appearing on the park soon – thanks to National Forest funding, in partnership with Severn Trent, we have produced four new interpretation panels to help inform visitors about the park and how important it is.

I hope you enjoy the better weather as we move into the Spring and hope to see you on the park soon. Don't forget that we have our usual packed season of Ranger-led walks, with booking available via our website.






# Village Archive Leicestershire Yeomanry Service in Bradgate Park

Every year at All Saints we welcome representatives of the Leicestershire Yeomanry to commemorate the First World War battle of Frezenberg. Many brave young soldiers lost their lives in the battle (281 took part, many were wounded and 94 were killed) and the Service is always a deeply moving event. On Saturday 14th May there is to be very special Service at All Saints for the laying up of the old Regimental guidon (flag), which will then hang in the north transept. This significant Service is being held on a Saturday as rather more people from the current Royal Yeomanry Squadron than usual will be attending. I wondered if the guidon shown in the photograph from 1953 is that now being laid up. As you can see very many people attended the Service in May 1953 which continued at the War Memorial in Bradgate Park. The photograph is very old and rather faded but we can still see how important it was for people to be there.




## Next Walk—Saturday 14th May

# THE FRIENDS OF CHARNWOOD FOREST



On Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> March the meeting of the Friends of the Charnwood Forest heard a talk given by Mr Richard Bailey on Bawden Lodge farm. His grandfather started the family business when he took up farming at Outwoods farm, and Bawden Lodge was acquired in the course of the following years. Because the prices of farm products are fixed whilst

suppliers to the farms do not suffer this restriction, costs rise and in-

comes do not. Thus there is a need to diversify.

Mr Bailey showed slides of the developing Bailey Wood which had been planted in 30 acres of the farm and was centred on an oak tree. Business premises had been created from farm buildings; recently these have tended to be let to businesses that are involved in life-styles. 220 Solar panels had been installed and were expected to pay for themselves within six years. Events, including weddings, concerts and plays had been put on. Mr Bailey made a point that weddings often involved starting preparations at 8.00 am and finally finishing between 2am and 3.am the next morning. The present author has been to performances of plays in the open air on the farm, and notes that car parking was provided

An old grain store has been converted into a shop cum café, and its turnover in the first four months of operation was greater than the farm's for the previous two years. As well as all this the farm is still an active business, and one slide depicted a cart of hay destined for a stables. Mr Bailey ended by warning of the dangers of isolation as a farmer. In his younger days he was chairman of the Farmers' Union, he is a borough councillor and was involved in the planning of the UNESCO geopark, which was the subject of the Friends last meeting.

The April meeting was beekeeping in Botany Bay in Charley. It took place at 7.30 p.m. on 20<sup>th</sup> April as advertised in our March magazine..

# 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> JUNE

Whilst you're enjoying the Spring Bank Holiday and the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, please come and enjoy a stroll round the **2 acre garden at 'Mountain Ash'** and help raise money for the NGS's several nursing charities.

Mike & Liz Newcombe's 'Mountain Ash' garden, which is situated halfway along Ulverscroft Lane between Newtown Linford and Ulverscroft, will be open to the public on the Late Spring Bank Holiday on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> June and on the Queens Platinum Jubilee on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> June **from 11.00am to 5.00pm.** 

This beautiful 2-acre garden has excellent views across a wide area of Charnwood countryside. Near the house are patios, a water feature, flower and shrub beds, a fruit cage, fruit trees, greenhouses and vegetable plots. Lawns slope down to a large wildlife pond with a waterfall, a gravel garden and three small areas of woodland with pleasant walks through many species of trees. The lower two thirds of the garden have been created since 2004, with over 200 conifers and deciduous trees planted. There are several places to sit and relax around the garden. Adding further interest, for both adults and children, there are about 50



garden statues and ornaments around the garden.

There will be stalls to browse and light refreshments will be available. There is a toilet available with exterior access from the garden. Admission for adults is £6.00, children are free and dogs on leads are welcome. Pre-booking is not required and tickets will be available online on the NGS website or can be bought at the gate.

# Leicestershire National Garden Scheme – Open gardens in May

There are 8 wonderful and inspiring gardens opening in May across Leicestershire. Our entrance fees are modest, delicious tea and cakes will be on sale plus children visit for free. All together this makes visiting one of our gardens a rewarding, but inexpensive trip out.

There are three gardens opening over the first bank holiday weekend in May. Hedgehog Hall at Tilton on the Hill, LE7 9DE, opens on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> May. A plant lovers paradise, there are herbaceous borders, a lavender walk, and an herb garden. The sheltered walled courtyard contains a collection of hosta, acers, ferns, a wisteria and climbing hydrangea and more. Opening on the same day is Westview, Great Glen, LE8 9EH which is a walled cottage garden including some rare and unusual plants, many grown from seed. On display is small auricula theatre and stone alpine troughs. Both gardens open from 11-4pm. Hedgehog Hall and Westview are also open on Bank Holiday Monday 2nd 11-4pm.

Opening on 1<sup>st</sup> May is Westbrook House, Little Bowden, LE16 8AX from 10.30 – 5pm where it is tulip time. Over 10,000 tulips planted for the May opening and there is much to see in this splendid, 6 acre garden. In addition to the blazing colour of the tulips expect to see a new secret gar-



den with fernery and water feature added in 2021, the courtyard which houses a collection of over 270 miniature and very small Hostas, access to the bluebell woodland area under a weeping willow tree and over a river bridge which leads to a folly, new for this opening.

## Tulips at Westbrook house, Little Bowden

The following Sunday afternoon, the 8<sup>th</sup> May, from 2-5pm Burrough Hall at Burrough on the Hill LE14 2QZ opens. Originally an old hunting lodge built in 1867, it is a wisteria clad house set within lovely gardens with sweeping lawns and views across Leicestershire. For the May opening there will also be a small collection of vintage cars on display.

On Sunday the 15<sup>th</sup> May 2 gardens are available to visit. Opening in the afternoon from 1-5pm is 1 The Dairy Swadlincote DE12 8DU. This is an

exciting Japanese themed garden with Japanese planting, a large koi carp pond and over 100 rhododendrons, camellias and azaleas, six ilex cloud trees, many acers and a pagoda along with some natural woodland areas.

Open all day Sunday May 15<sup>th</sup> from 10-5pm is Whatton House an ideal destination for a family day out with 15 acres of garden to enjoy including picnic areas, woodland walks, a rose garden, and views of Charnwood forest. There is also a Chinese garden complete with a terracotta warrior, Dutch garden and an arboretum.

During the last weekend of May 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> from 2-5 pm, 88 Brook Street and 109 Brook Street in Wymeswold open together and one en-

trance fee covers both gardens. 88 Brook Street LE12 6TU is a quirky garden with three different areas: the first has a mature ash tree under planted with ferns, camellia. astrantia, clematis, persicaria, geraniums, globe thistles and roses. The second area has numerous water features and two topiary elephants. The third is a working area including a greenhouse, vegetable beds and an orchard.

109 Brook Street LE12 6TT is a garden of around an acre with lovely traditional planting of a rose and clematis patio, and a herbaceous border enclosed by yew hedges. This is contrasted by a wild area with a pond, wild flower meadow fringe and woodland walk. There is an extensive rainwater harvesting system that includes 4000 gallons of storage and a variety of watering systems operated by solar power, tours are available. In addition to tea and cakes, there will also be a plant sale.

Your donations and purchases at our open gardens raise valuable funds. Your visit counts and by visiting one of our gardens you can enjoy a warm welcome, a relaxing time out with nature and help raise important funds for our charities. # Newtown Linford Neighbourhood Watch - A member of the Parish Council



Sadly, there has been a spate of burglaries and attempted burglaries in Newtown Linford during recent weeks. These reports are being investigated and detectives at Loughborough Police Station have been working hard to identify suspects.

Over 20K People Fell Victim to Remote Access Scams

More than £50 million was lost last year to scams where victims are tricked into handing over control of their computer or smartphone to criminals.

New data from Action Fraud, the national reporting centre for fraud and cybercrime, reveals that 20,144 people fell victim to scams where they were persuaded to grant criminals remote access to their device. Victims reported losing a total of £57,790,384 – an average loss of £2,868 per victim.

#### What are remote access scams?

Remote Access scams will often begin with a browser pop-up saying that your computer is infected with a virus, or maybe a call from someone claiming to be from your bank saying that they need to connect to your computer in order to cancel a fraudulent transaction on your account. Regardless of the narrative the fraudster's use, their goal is to steal your money or access your financial information by tricking you into allowing them to remotely connect to your computer.

Detective Chief Inspector Craig Mullish, from the City of London Police, said:

"While remote access tools are safe when used legitimately, we want the public to be aware that they can be misused by criminals to perpetrate fraud. We often see criminals posing as legitimate businesses in order to trick people into handing over control of their computer or smartphone. You should only install software or grant remote access to your computer if you're asked by someone you know and trust, such as a friend or family member and never as a result of an unsolicited call, browser pop-up or text message".

# How to protect yourself

As indicated above, only install software or grant remote access to your computer if you're asked by someone you know and trust, such as a

friend or family member, and never as a result of an unsolicited call, browser pop up, or text message.

Remember, a bank or service provider will never contact you out of the blue requesting remote access to your device.

If you believe your laptop, PC, tablet or phone has been infected with a virus or some other type of malware, follow the NCSC's guidance on recovering an infected device.

Protect your money by contacting your bank immediately on a different device from the one the scammer contacted you on.

Report it to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 or via actionfraud.police.uk.

## **Elderly Targeted At Cash Machines**

Leicestershire Police are warning elderly residents to be vigilant when withdrawing money from cash machines.

It follows a small number of thefts from victims who have typically been approached mid-transaction and distracted or pushed to one side.

The victim's account has then had the maximum withdrawal taken in some cases.

Officers are investigating the incidents but are issuing the following advice:

Be aware of people standing too close or trying to distract you while using the machine.

If someone is too close to you, get your card out without withdrawing any money and walk away.

If possible use a cash machine located inside a bank's premises Report suspicious activity to the police on 101.
