ueen Elizabeth II was born in 1926, at a time when cars were still scarce on the streets, most homes lacked running water, and the population of Newtown Linford was a fraction of the current size. We celebrate her 90<sup>th</sup> birthday officially this month. She has lived through some of the most astonishing changes and developments in history, reigning longer than any other monarch in our history. Her personal commitment to her duty as Queen and in her service of her people, and particularly to the vast number of charities she supports, is inspiring. How has she managed it? How has she, in a life which has seen huge change around her and has been full of personal ups and downs too, kept going with such perseverance and grace?

In a book published this year the Queen herself, in a foreword, acknowledges her dependence on the faithfulness of God and the prayers of so many people throughout the Commonwealth over her lifetime. Her Christmas broadcasts have often spoken of her own faith in the King born in a stable, the King who has drawn her own obedience and allegiance.

The Queen's life and service is worth celebrating. Thousands of people will gather in St James's Park in London on Sunday 12 June for one of the UKs largest street parties, and we, with other communities up and down the country will join in and celebrate in a similar style. I'm delighted that the Church will be at the heart of that celebration, just as her faith in God has been at the heart of all that has sustained our Sovereign.

I hope to see you there as we join in celebrating our Queen and our community.

## News from the Park DEVELOPMENTS

The Bradgate Park Trust has been in existence as a charity since 1928. Nevertheless, a large number of people are still under the impression that Bradgate Park is owned and operated by the County Council. Twenty years ago the County Council contributed some 25% of our income with a similar proportion being paid in by Leicester City Council. Since then times have changed and in the current financial year the two Local Authorities will contribute around 3% of our operating budget between them with over 80% of the Trust's income now being generated on site.

Achieving greater recognition of the Trust is important partly because we hope people will feel better disposed to paying their parking fee knowing that it is not going to "the Council" and also because we want people to support us with their time as well as their money and achieving greater 'brand awareness' of the Trust as a charity is an important factor in encouraging this.

To help us achieve this, we have employed a new Development Officer. Carolyn Holmes is an ecologist by training and has had a varied career spanning museums, country parks, community development and fundraising. One of the exciting initiatives that Carolyn will be leading on is the development of a Friends of Bradgate Park group, of which we hope to announce details over the coming months, but her first major task is organising the public consultation exercise around the new dog rules in the Park. The first phase of this has been canvassing the views of our season ticket holders, as a result of which regular dog walkers will be pleased to hear that we have modified the 'dogs on leads' restriction slightly so that it will apply between 9am and dusk between 1st April (Good Friday if earlier) and 31st October on the areas of the Park below the Middle Wall. As we do not want to encourage an early morning influx of problem dogs, you may not see us publicising this change particularly heavily but it will be in the wording of the Public Spaces Protection Order and will be what we enforce so don't panic if it is not mentioned in the media

On the subject of development, the new Visitor Centre is progressing well. The builder handed over the site to the exhibition installer in mid-May and we are on target to open at the beginning of July, hopefully with the luxury of a few days 'soft opening' during the last week in June. As part of the Visitor Centre development we are converting the old entrance lobby to a 'kiosk' serving takeaway hot and cold drinks and ice creams, which will take some of the pressure off the queue in the

Deer Barn Tearoom.

If you have not already got your tickets for the Bradgate Proms on 16<sup>th</sup> July, I encourage you to either go online to <a href="www.seetickets.com">www.seetickets.com</a> or call into the Conservatory Tearoom where you will save the online booking fee. Before then we have the first of this season's theatre evenings, 'Wuthering Heights' on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> June.

Residents may have noticed that we have installed 'crocodile teeth' across the exit road from the Newtown Linford car park. These are designed to stop cars entering the car park from the wrong direction when we are busy and causing disruption and also so that we can secure the car park after dark and stop it being used for various antisocial activities. If this measure is successful we plan to install similar measures in the other car parks.

Regular walkers on the Park will have noticed the show of bluebells in some of the areas where the bracken has been controlled. I wrote about the beneficial effect that our bracken management had had on the Park's biodiversity in April and this spring show of colour is another example of this. The small yellow flowers of Tormentil are beginning to appear and these will soon be followed by the white clusters of tiny flowers of Heath Bedstraw. Taking advantage of the abundant insect life feeding on these nectar sources, the song of the Skylark can now be heard and the sharpeyed are likely to spot a Green Woodpecker or two feeding on the many anthills around the Ruins and hear the unmistakeable knocking of its Greater Spotted namesake coming from a nearby tree.

### From the Records

I heard this week that he village ramblers were taken on a walk in Sheet Hedges Wood by Claire and Joe Costello. I searched the Village Records and found the invitation to the grand opening on 8th June 1998 by Mrs CE Brock, the Chairman of Leicestershire County Council. The County Council had carried out a two year programme of woodland management operations to prepare the new plantation in the wood.

Work had included the harvesting of mature timber, replanting areas and coppicing hazel trees. The newly opened facilities included a car park and a system of marked trails which take visitors through the old part of Sheet Hedges Wood which was recorded as long ago as the 14th Century.

The wood is a designated site of special scientific interest and the woodland work was carried out with the support of English Nature. The picture is of Newtown Linford School who helped replant some areas of woodland and were invited to the opening ceremony.

There were demonstrations of charcoal burning and timber extraction using horses.

A County Council spokesman said "The opening of the car park and trails provide visitors with an opportunity to explore two very different yet beautiful areas of woodland and will provide attractive alternatives to other recreational facilities in the area.

The trails are still there but the car park was shut because it attracted undesirable visitors.



















## **NEWTOWN LINFORD BOULES**

### **Boule Facts**

Pétanque is a form of boules played in South West France. The current game originated in 1910 in Provence. The word Pétanque means

"fixed feet" in the local dialect. So before we play an end the first player scribes a circle with his foot, in which each player stands for his turn. Prior to the 1910 rules players were allowed to run three steps. These new rules spread across France so that Boules and Pétanque are now basically the same game.



## Fracking, our new neighbour?

There was a near capacity audience of 60 members and 31 guests at Woodhouse Eaves Village Hall. Dick Howard, our speaker finder and past Chairman, introduced our talk at the meeting on 25th April, saying that he had chosen this title as Charnwood Forest had been neighbours to so much "nasty" extractive industry that he wondered if fracking for gas might be yet another such neighbour.

Our speaker, David Bridge, is a retired geologist with much experience in the oil and gas industry. He served for many years with the British Geological Survey. It quickly became clear that his factual explanations were unbiased and could be respected. However it was equally clear from what he said that there is an ever increasing requirement for gas in the UK and a diminishing reliability of supply into the future.

On the other hand, his detailed explanation of the process of fracking to obtain a new supply of gas left few in doubt that the process was an expensive, messy and dirty business with many threats of pollution and disturbance, all for perhaps a 40 year supply. Much remains to be established.

The search area of interest to us - called Bowland - covers the full width of the UK across the north Midlands and northern England. The southern extremity includes Loughborough. Not far to the north there seem to be deposits which might be worth exploring. The regulatory framework covering exploration and extraction will be demanding. So far, no licences have been issued for Leicestershire.

David left us to make up our own minds on the subject. Our guests included a group of protesters whose noisy interruptions were capably countered by our officers and our speaker. They had not come to listen to the factual explanations but to make their own points.

The evening concluded as usual with informal discussion, lubricated by wine and a few nibbles.



## **Newtown Linford Parish Council**



Our Annual Meeting of the Parish (not to be called an AGM) followed by the Annual Parish Council meeting will have taken place on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2016. At this meeting it is hoped that a new Chair and Vice Chair will have been elected along with the appointment of two Parish Councillors to fill the casual vacancies. Last month Tara Pickles of Markfield Lane was appointed to fill another casual vacancy. This new team will face many challenges over the coming months and Lydia and I will do our best to guide them in the correct direction.

Councillor Dr. Sue Pritchard writes to acknowledge the changes on our Council.

### **Dr Richard Lowe**

Dick retires from the Council having been a Councillor since May 1998. In addition to his general duties as a Parish councillor over this time he has also used his professional skills as our Tree Warden - liaising

with Charnwood and advising on tree issues to protect the green and pleasant environment that we all enjoy.

### Ken Waterfall

Ken joined the Parish Council way back in 1979, about the same time that Margaret Thatcher became prime minister. He served on the Council until 1988 when he was elected Chairman, taking over from Bob Bown – whose campaign had previously saved the village from the predations of the M1. He was a reliable and hardworking Chairman, only taking one year off from his Chairman's duties between 1988 and 2016. At a rough estimation he has attended well over 400 meetings.

During these years he carried out the sometimes difficult duties of the Parish Council Chairman, ensuring that the cemetery, churchyard and public spaces in the Village were well maintained by our contractors, liaising with the Police on crime prevention and traffic issues. He represented the Parish Council at numerous Leicestershire County Council events and made sure that Newtown Linford had a voice when issues pertaining to our Parish were discussed. All planning applications were carefully considered and he was a crucial part of constructing the Village Design Statement, to ensure, where possible, the look and nature of our unique village would be protected when developments and redevelopments/improvements were required.

The refurbishment of the Village Hall was another project that was helped by Ken negotiating and obtaining a public works loan in the name of the Parish Council and the Hall was reopened in 2007. Ken has also represented the Parish Council on the Village Hall Committee and he and Michael Upstone (and latterly Toby Manning) have worked together to ensure this Hall is maintained and run for the benefit of our community. He drove a hard bargain whenever the rent for the hall was reviewed by Everards!

In September 2008 the Bob Bown children's playground behind Grey Crescent was reopened with all the new play equipment and the football area that our children enjoy today. Ken was the driving force in obtaining the grants, employing the contractors and purchasing this equipment and he regularly inspected the playground to ensure its safe use, identifying issues and liaising with the equipment companies.

By the time this Magazine is distributed the Parish Council APM will have happened. I'm sure the new Councillors will join with old to say a very grateful thank you to both of these gentlemen who have served the Vil lage so well for so long.

Finally last but definitely not least Lydia Knott our Parish Clerk retires on 31<sup>st</sup> August in the month when she completes 45 years of admirable service. She will be a hard act to follow but I will do my best. On this subject I must point out that whilst we were aware that a Councillor could not be paid as a Clerk, we were only told by the powers that be last week that a retiring Councillor cannot be paid to do the job for a whole year after resigning as a Councillor. We have to create a Clerk position without profit for me until 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017 but I will still do my best for the village in this unpaid position.
