

### December 2022: The great invitation

I still remember it arriving: the quality vellum paper of the envelope, let alone the contents. The stiff and formal printing, the embossed seal. An invitation to a garden party at Buckingham Palace. Unfortunately, it bore the names of my mother and father, rather than my 17-year-old self, so there was never any question I would be going. But nonetheless, the arrival of the invitation itself was an occasion, let alone the event itself. I must ask my parents if they still have it.

Invitations to royal events are in the news as I write, or at least one now ex-Cabinet minister's reaction to not receiving one. Being invited, the chance to be part of something significant, is valuable – it affirms our own sense of worth to the extent we value the source of the invitation.

When you look again at the events of the first Christmas, one of the things which strikes me is the wonder of the invitations: the angel to Mary and Joseph, the host of angels appearing to the shepherds, the star drawing

strangers from the East. And if the invitations are great, how much more the event to which they drew people: to meet Jesus, God's Son and Saviour.

This year I am grateful to again be the conduit of the same great invitation. I'm no star, certainly no angel, but I have the privilege of being able to say to you, as was said over 2000



years ago: You are invited; come and meet Jesus, God's Son and Saviour. Come and find out how his birth transformed reality and still brings hope and joy today.

### 200 Editions and counting!

In the Spring of 2000, after the excitement of the new millennium, the Parish Council held a meeting in the Village Hall to discuss holding a review of the village, and to arrange for a survey and a report to be prepared. A Village Appraisal report followed in 2001 which gave a detailed picture of the community, its needs, problems and opportunities.

Part of the survey was designed to discover how residents found out about people and events in the village. Many wished to see a village diary of events and a new monthly village magazine. At that time, the only local publication available was the Parish Magazine produced by All Saints Church which was delivered to members of the Church congregation at a cost of £5 per year. This was edited by Jackie Parish.

The Parish Council and the Church Council agreed that the wishes of the village could be met by replacing the existing Parish Magazine with a new Village publication which should go to all households and should be free. This has been achieved by a donation each year from the Parish Council and from the Church Council together with income produced from advertising.

Producing the new magazine was a major challenge, and we have been so fortunate that Carole and Julian Heubeck accepted this challenge and agreed to take it on.

For the past twenty years and 200 editions, Carole has produced an interesting and attractive magazine each month and has encouraged regular contributors to provide local stories and events. Julian has developed a reliable network of local advertisers which is a vital part of funding. Our grateful thanks are due to Carole and Julian for their hard work and dedication. Few people could have shown such commitment, and Carole gives so much of her time and energy every month to ensure that the copy goes to the printer on time.

Thanks are also due to many other people who have contributed to the success of the magazine including Alan Iliffe, and later Peter Sayers, who collect the magazines from the printer and take them to the small army of people who distribute to houses in the village and also to David Couling who has acted as Treasurer for the Magazine Committee.

Thanks are due to all who have helped in any way towards the ongoing success of the magazine.





often take part in Church and have our Brownies flag held high in procession.


At our last meeting we played indoor archery and had great fun with real targets. It was really hard to shoot straight and made a lovely popping sound

### **Asset of Community Value**

I am pleased to announce that Charnwood Borough Council has agreed that the Village Hall is an "Asset of Community Value".

This means that, in the event that the building is put up for sale, an eligible community organisation can trigger a six-month moratorium period if they want to purchase the asset. During this six-month period the asset cannot be sold on the open market, only to qualifying community interest groups. This allows qualifying community interest groups six months to raise capital and bid for the asset at market value.

While we do not currently expect this process to be triggered, we need to be aware that our current lease expires in 2029 – and the future is always uncertain.

### Planning Update.

I have been able to request information from a previous pre-application for the proposed site south of Markfield Lane, Newtown Linford, planning application number P/22/1031/2.

In my opinion, although planning policy may have changed since this pre-application, it does refer to the areas that I have raised in my submissions to the Charnwood Borough Council consultation. These include ecology, highways and sustainability. I note in the pre-application response from the Council it is stated: 'From a highway point of view, they do not consider that the location of the site is sustainable, as it is some way from the nearby village centre of Markfield and is separated from the village by the very busy A50'. I suggest if the A50 was very busy 10 years ago, it has certainly increased in the number of vehicles travelling along the road today.

I understand the Council are aware of the important ecological features onsite and the adjacent ancient woodland.

May I take this opportunity to thank all the residents who have sent their submissions to Charnwood Borough Council. I will keep you informed whilst this latest application goes through the planning process.

On 15<sup>th</sup> November I attended the Appeal Hearing at Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council (HBBC) offices along with Newtown Linford Parish Council Chair, Sue Pritchard. This Hearing was because HBBC refused the application for up to 93 dwelling on land adjacent to Ashby Road, Markfield. The site is mostly within Newtown Linford Parish. You may recall Charnwood Borough Council permitted this development at a previous Plans meeting. We were able to take part in the Hearing process, I was keen to point out about the Markfield Neighbourhood Plan which, in my view, should be given full weight when decision are made, especially as the Markfield services and facilities will be used by the people living in the proposed houses. We now have to wait for the decision of the Inspector, possibly in the New Year.







The support can be anything that is helping the residents in Charnwood, from a one-off event to an ongoing activity, specialist support to advice service.

The Council will add the information to the Charnwood Community Action Campaign webpage to help promote and sign-post to the support being offered. The Council will also share this information on the Council's social media channels, e-mail alerts and printed materials where possible.

### **New Parliamentary Constituencies.**

The Boundary Commission for England is redrawing boundaries for Parliamentary constituencies in order to rebalance the number of electors represented by each MP, and the final consultation is now open. Constituency sizes currently vary widely, due to population changes since



the last boundary review. The new map proposed by the Commission will make sure each constituency has between 69,724 and 77,062 electors, so that each MP represents roughly the same number of electors. The Boundary Review also requires that the number of constituencies in England increases from 533 to 543.

The Commission has listened to the feedback sent in from the public and has changed nearly half of the initial proposals published last year. The new revised proposals are now available to view via an interactive map on the consultation website. A final consultation is now open until 5<sup>th</sup> December 2022 and is the last chance to provide your views on the constituency boundaries. The Boundary Commission for England has invited the public to visit their website <a href="mailto:bcereviews.org.uk">bcereviews.org.uk</a> and comment on the proposals.

Looking at the proposals it seems Newtown Linford Parish is proposed to be in a new constituency called Mid Leicestershire. This proposal changes from the current Charnwood boundaries. Looking at the map provided Mid Leicestershire includes Markfield, and Ratby but not Syston and East Goscote which will become part of another new constituency, Melton and Syston.

#### Remembrance Service.

On Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> November I represented the Leicestershire County Council Chairman at the Remembrance Service and Parade at the Arch of Remembrance, Victo-



ria Park, Leicester. This Service of Remembrance continues to remember those men and women of Leicester and Leicestershire who have given their lives in the service of their country, in the cause of freedom, justice and peace.

The Service was led by the Bishop of Leicester. The Right Reverend Martyn Snow and Dave Andrews DL. During the formal wreath laying part of the service I laid a wreath on behalf of the people of Leicestershire. It was so good to see so many people attending this service. **We will remember them.** 

As we approach Christmas and the beginning of the New Year. May I take this opportunity to thank all the people involved with producing the Newtown Linford Parish Magazine, for the brilliant contribution they make throughout the year, communicating local news and interesting articles for the local community. 

- Your bank or any other official source will never ask you to supply personal information via email

#### **Bob Bown Memorial Field**

We still await final costings for the Bob Bown Memorial Field Play Park improvement works but here is a sneaky peek at the plans....

Various new pieces of play equipment including a see-saw, climbing wall and streetboard springie and improved surfacing to replace the existing wetpour, will be installed as soon as practically possible. The timber framed trail will be removed in its entirety to make way for the new

equipment. A staggered approach to the improvement works will mean



gaps in play facilities in the short term. This financial year, the Council has committed up to £15,000 for the initial installations. During the next financial period in 2023/24, further new equipment will be purchased to fill the remaining gaps. It is hoped we might be eligible for some further external funding to help with the cost of replacing the old timber trail which was first installed in 2004! Any new equipment which is not timber, will be painted in the same colours as the infant modular play unit installed in 2021, which will be more in keeping with the surrounding area.

Usually, graves are levelled and turfed 8 months after interment, however, if the 8 months comes during Spring or Summer, plots will be seeded rather than turfed.
