

There were so many things which were painful last year. For me, one of the most frustrating losses was our inability to mark the season of remembering which comes at this time of year in anything like our usual ways.

Whether it is a coincidence of timings, or whether it's connected to the drawing in of evenings, the slowing of pace as we enter winter, this time of year is one in which memories float to the surface. When we look back over our experience and perhaps have time to travel into and through the difficult landscape of loss. After the last 18 months, there is special need in our communities to pause, reflect and remember.

Of course, the main opportunity which may come to mind is the events of Remembrance, on Sunday and on Armistice Day. But before that comes a more immediate, perhaps more personal remembering. On the Sunday close to All Souls (2 November) we usually invite everyone whose loved one has had a funeral at All Saints' or taken by a member of our clergy to a special service to light a candle and remember them again with thanksgiving. Last year that was severely limited, just at the time when grief needed expression after the restrictions and complexity which made bereavement even harder during lockdown. With things different this year. I would like to invite anyone in the community who has suffered loss – due to Covid or any other reason – in the past 18 months to attend this service at 4.30pm on Sunday 31th October. We all need opportunities to mark and express our memories of those who have died. Please let me know the name of your loved one in advance so they can be named aloud in the service (register interest at www.allsaintsnewtownlinford.org.uk/services).

And then Remembrance itself. With the second lockdown in place, we could not gather at all last November. I am sure you shared my disappointment. This year we intend to resume our communal honouring of those who gave their lives and health in service of others in conflict. Joined by the Brownies and representatives of the Parish Council, our Remembrance Service in Church on 14th November will begin at 10.50am as we remember the fallen and pray for peace. We will though continue one new practice we started last year. An area of the Churchyard, just to the left of the path as you enter, will be set aside as a poppy garden, where you can plant a poppy in first fortnight of November.

From the Village Archives Legend of the secret tunnels of Bradgate House

Those secret tunnels from Bradgate House to Groby Old Hall (roughly contemporary), to Ulverscroft Priory, or even to the city..... do they really exist? Sadly no.

For many years it was believed that passages were tunnelled. However, that turned out to be merely a legend which may have sprung from the mediaeval custom of providing a castle with a secret escape route for the use of beleaguered defenders who might need to flee in a hurry. In 1978 the author Mr Aubrey W Stevenson explained in a leaflet prepared for Leicestershire Libraries that Bradgate was a private mansion and not a castle. It was one of the first unfortified Great Houses and a possible need to escape in very troubled times may not of been far from the mind of the Marquis of Dorset who built it. It is possible that a short tunnel existed for perhaps 200 yards to the north but no other traces were ever found, only underground water circuits and collecting tanks. Using reprints of old maps photographs and quite a lot of facts, Mr Stevenson did a great deal of research back in 1978.

The leaflet was entitled "Get to know Bradgate" It would be interesting to know if any one still has a copy.

Newtown Linford Biodiversity Group

Around 30 residents attended Newtown Linford Biodiversity Group's Open Evening at the Village Hall on 12th October. Representatives from Leicestershire and Rutland Wildlife Trust, including Neil Pilcher, Senior Conservation Officer, and visitors

from the neigh-

bouring parish of Ulverscroft, were also at the event.

The group delivered a slide presentation which gave some alarming statis-



tics reflecting the severe decline in

biodiversity; an example being that there are approx.40 million fewer birds in this country than 50 years ago. A Natural History Museum report published a few days before the meeting confirmed the U.K. as one of the most nature-depleted countries in the world.

The group went on to describe how good management of habitats, especially grassland, can improve their biodiversity and support more wildlife. Examples of the group's activities were also included in the talk-from Himalayan Balsam clearance and wildlife verge management, to



nature walks and a garden wildlife survey.

At the local Primary School Joan was a shining light, gaining a scholarship to Loughborough High. I recall her telling me she had read every book in the school, the teachers went and bought more to satisfy her lust for reading.

Due to family circumstances, (her father passed away at the age of 49). Joan left full time education to take up employment with the Gas Board, then on to AEI, before moving on to Victory Tyres. This is where she was working when I first met Joan. By a strange co-incidence the owners of Victory Tyres were also called Snart. She always said she would make him change his name if she was to marry someone with that name, thankfully she changed her mind.

This was a chance meeting; I was in the Royal Air Force stationed in Lincolnshire. I came over to stay with my Gran to watch Leicester City. If it wasn't for her sister Iris missing the last bus home from the village and walking her home, I would have never met Joan.

After about 6 months coming over most weekends from Lincolnshire, I had the news I had been posted to Cyprus. I remember phoning Joan that evening saying, 'will you marry me, and you come too'. Luckily Joan said yes, and we were married in Newtown Linford Church on the 26th September 1963. Joan had never been out of the country before, so it was a big decision to make to leave the family home.

Joan always put the family first, building the home around the children Carolyn and Alan, then Grandchildren and lately the Great Grandchildren. She would spend hours with the Grandchildren on her knee reading book after book, Alfie and Annie Rose was one of the favourites. Joan spent an enormous amount of time with all the Grandchildren, meeting them out of school, looking after them whilst their parents were working, visits to Bradgate Park were the highlight. She was so proud of their achievements.

It was when I was elected to be a Councillor on both County and Borough that Joan was so supportive, this was a tremendous partnership. This was especially true when she was Consort at the County Council and Mayoress at Charnwood Borough. What a great time she had meeting so many people and making new friends. If I may I will read a quote from a letter I have received. 'She will be missed by so many people but remembered by so many with such affection. I will remem-



ber all the happy times that I spent with Joan.

I will finish with a big thank you to all who have sent messages of support and the kind words they have said about Joan's life.



Newtown Linford Neighbourhood Watch -A member of the Parish Council



This month's update comes from our local police beat team, PC Greg Moore and PCSO Mitch Jarvis....

"Hi all,

We hope you're all well. For those of you that haven't met us before, we're PC 330 Greg Moore and PCSO 6093 Mitch Jarvis and we're your local police beat team. We have our office in Anstey and are responsible for Anstey, Thurcaston, Cropston and Newtown Linford. We work a rotating shift pattern between the hours of 8am and midnight, 7 days a week and 365 days a year and usually 6 days in a row. On the days that we aren't physically at work, we're ably assisted by the neighbourhood officers from nearby beat areas and of course, our 24/7 Charnwood LPO (response) police officers.

We wanted to let you know that we're fully aware of the issues of speeding vehicles in the Village, whether those be cars or delivery drivers coming in to visit the Village or Bradgate Park, or just passing through and of course the HGVs travelling through at all times of day and night. We're aware that vehicles are speeding as they come into the Village from all directions, with the most prominent and impactive of these being along Bradgate Road from Anstey and along Main Street from Sharpley Hill.

We do organise regular speed operations around our villages. Sometimes these are high visibility and sometimes more covert (although we must stress that the covert ones are for our information only - the reason for these is that it gives us a truer idea of speeding statistics, as unsurprisingly people usually slow down when they see our yellow jackets!) but what we can tell you from recent surveys is that compliance with speed limits in Newtown Linford is nowhere near as good as we'd like it to be. You're more likely to see us on these speed ops in the upcoming weeks and months, as we work to help motorists keep their speed below the legal limits. This will take the form of education and/or enforcement where necessary.

We'd like to remind you that the MINIMUM penalty for speeding is £100 and 3 penalty points on your driving licence – you "may" be offered a speed awareness course for driving slightly over the speed limit but these typically cost about £100 and you HAVE to declare them to your insurance company, which of course is likely to push your premium up.

We'd also like to remind you that any money from speeding fines does NOT go to the Police and that we don't do this to "pay for our Christmas party" but we do this to try and keep our roads safer places to be!

So how are we going to slow drivers down?

Over the coming weeks and months, we will be working with Newtown Linford Parish Council, Leicestershire County Council, Highways and our own Leicestershire Police Road Safety Unit, Traffic Management Department and Safer Roads Team and between us, we're all very keen to find solutions.

Our Road Safety Unit, Traffic Management Department and Safer Roads Team (and us of course), can complete covert and overt speed surveys, gather statistics and enforce offences where practicable and necessary and this in itself can lower instances of speeding. We do, however, also realise that this won't be the be all and end all and that more than this is required to really fix this issue and that's why we're working in conjunction with local councils as well. Between us we'll sit down and look at road geography and layouts, speed limits, sign positioning and traffic calming measures and see what —

- 1) Works
- 2) Doesn't work
- 3) Could be changed
- 4) Could be removed
- 5) Could be added

We hope you'll all appreciate that this will take some time and some solutions may be more financially viable than others but between us all we'll do whatever we can to try and slow down vehicles in the Village. There is obviously a lot of work to do here for us and our partner agencies and at this point in time we have ideas but not all of the answers! Please be assured that although progress sometimes seems slow, we are making progress and will have more of the answers over the coming few months.

Bob Bown Memorial Field

Our grass cutting schedule has now come to an end for the 2021 season. I continue to look into alternative provisions for next year's grounds maintenance contract, to ensure best value.

Cemetery and Churchyard

As previously reported, Newtown Linford Parish Council, have been awarded a SHIRE Environment Grant by LCC for the installation of bat, bird and owl boxes, hedgehog and insect hotels at all three Parish Council maintained sites. I have set a completion date of 31st March 2022 for the boxes to be installed by and will be submitting a faculty application to the Church of England for the installations intended for the Churchyard.

All being well, as soon as permission is received, work will start across all sites.

Chairman, Sue Pritchard and I met with sculptor, Peter Leadbeater, regarding the multi stemmed poplar tree at the Cemetery, which is due to be felled in early November due to health and safety concerns. Peter has been booked to attend in March 2022 to carve the remains of the tree stump into an appropriate abstract art form resembling an eternal flame. The total cost of the sculpture will be £1025. We would be very grateful if there are any residents who would like to make a donation towards the cost of our new sculpture. We know the tree fell has come as a disappointment to some villagers and this is our way of turning this negative into something more positive for Cemetery visitors to enjoy.


