I've just been fixing a slow puncture on my daughter's paddling pool. It's an essential piece of garden furniture in this heat, but it unfortunately got caught on a trailing rose bush last time we moved it and has been subsiding ever since.

Problem was, it was only a slow puncture, so it was barely noticeable at first. Just a little more sagging at the edges, a little less resistance to a push. And then, before you knew it, the water was pouring over the edge. It may not have been as dramatic as a big pop, but the end result was the same: a sad, unusable pool.

For some of us, that echoes the experience of lockdown. We started quite brightly – willing to take on the once in a lifetime challenge of a worldwide pandemic. Yes, it was hard but there was also an adrenaline rush, energy which came from finding new ways to cope. But slowly, over time, that energy has worn away, the adrenaline subsided, and left us feeling flat.

The danger is that, like a slow puncture, we overlook it because it has been a gradual process. We see the dramatic problems that others face and think we can just ignore our own sadness because it's no big deal. But the end result can be the same if we're not careful.

There are lots of things which you can try to help – none are quite the same as the quick patch fix I've used on the paddling pool, but many things can help us stay inflated. From finding a new hobby, to getting a little more fresh air and exercise, to finding someone just to talk through how you're feeling. You're always welcome to contact me if you'd like to talk.

Praying also helps. Sometimes Christians, as much as anyone, can view mental health issues as somehow a mark of failure. But it isn't, it's a natural psychological reaction to testing times. Jesus sometimes felt down and discouraged, we see in the gospels.

Mayor of Charnwood.

Since becoming Mayor of Charnwood at a virtual Mayor Making ceremony the Mayoress and myself have started to attend engagements. We visited Loughborough University where we were able to welcome Olympic Gold Medal winner Adam Peaty back to the swimming pool, which is now open for Loughborough's international athletes to resume training in the run-up to the Olympic Games in Tokyo next year. We also made a visit to the Charnwood Community Action Hub to mark the delivery of the 10,000th food parcel. Since launching in March, Charnwood Community Action, which is a partnership with the Borough Council, John Storer House and other voluntary organisations, have delivered this amount of parcels and they are currently delivering to around 600 households each week. 





Volunteers enable All Saints Church to re-open

The first Service since 29th December 2019 was held in All Saints Church on Sunday 9th August. The Church was cleared on 30th December to accommodate the contractors for the re-painting and the installation of new lighting and sound system. This required the erection of scaffolding inside the building. We had expected to be in by Easter and a Service incorporating the Choral Society singing Bob Chilcott's Little Jazz Mass was planned. Then, of course, everything was closed down, including work by the contractors, because of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Thanks are due to the Rector, Richard Trethewey, who not only has kept online services running throughout the whole period but has enabled All Saints to be one of the first Churches in the area to re-open once this was permitted by the Government. This would not have been possible had it not been for all the volunteers who came in to clean the Church once the handover from the contractors was completed on 3rd August. Social distancing etc had to be observed so only two people at a time could work in there. Particular thanks are due to the two Churchwardens, Michele Petty and Jane Woolmer, for sorting out the necessary risk assessments and a rota of cleaners, and to Sheila Langton, herself a Churchwarden for many years and THE expert on where and what to clean!! Many people who were not all regular members of the congregation volunteered too, showing that All Saints Church is still very much part of village life in Newtown Linford. I thought last Sunday that the carvings on the front of the altar and the altar rails have never gleamed so brightly - someone worked very hard on those. Thanks also to Sue Howard and her helpers for the flowers by the altar, which helped redeem the somewhat restrictive atmosphere made necessary by the need for social distancing and the wearing of face masks. Singing is currently not permitted but the new sound system does enable music to be played. It is fortunate that Richard Trethewey is so competent with modern audiovisual systems. The Church is not yet fully open but times for private prayer will be possible soon.

I was unable to take part in all this myself because of a fractured wrist so my heartfelt thanks go to all those who did take part in a marathon cleaning campaign.

Lockdown restrictions have now eased though and I'm very pleased to see Village businesses and sports clubs have now reopened with safe measures in place for social distancing.

LCC Highways are currently investigating whether additional measures can be implemented to prevent the barriers from blowing over in windy weather.

Bob Bown Memorial Field

Following a four month closure, the Bob Bown Memorial Field has reopened much to the delight of our younger residents. You will see Guidance for Safe Use signage has been installed around the play park and I have attached a copy to this article for your reference. Please note, hand sanitiser is not provided at the park and park users are advised to take their own.

Our signs were kindly designed by talented resident, Billy Rigg, see page 30) who came to the rescue of a somewhat tech challenged Clerk! Our

sincere thanks go to Billy for his assistance.

During the closure, two independent operational safety inspections were carried out and sadly, the football fencing and goals were deemed unsafe.

In the interest of public safety, the decision was made to remove the offending items, to enable the park to reopen for those keen to make use of the other areas.

We are investigating funding sources to replace both the fencing and goals and to update other areas of the park, hopefully, later in the year/early 2021.

I am keen to hear the views of park users and have so far received suggestions of a zip line, basket swing, climbing wall and more provision for infant children, such as an all-encompassing modular play unit.

I can't make any promises but we are looking into each of these suggestions in the hope we may be able to accommodate some of them and are already receiving quotations. It will depend on the level of funding we can secure, as these types of items are not cheap.

Lastly, if you are using the play park for other art and craft activities, could I please kindly ask that you give the benches a quick wipe down

after use, as it is more difficult to remove paints and glitter glue once it has dried? Thank you.

Cemetery and Churchyard

Chairman, Sue Pritchard, has worked really hard on the bund area to the right of the entrance gate to the Cemetery. A number of geraniums have been planted there and are settling in nicely.

Further bulbs have also been planted ready for Spring 2021.
