# Bradgate Group Parish



don't really do Twitter. Some of you are natives, others may be asking 'What is Twitter?' But this summer I have been checking it almost daily. Not just for updates on the Lambeth Conference, or the test match, but for one person's daily updates: @HayleyFern4 otherwise known as 'Hayley Draws Churches'.

Hayley's day job is as a teacher, but during the school holidays she's embarked on a project of painting every church in the Diocese of Leicester – there are about 310 of them! So far she's done about 50, still a long way to go. As she paints them she takes a photo of the completed work and posts it on Twitter. They are a fascinating – and beautiful – collection. I have a professional interest: one of my roles is as Chair of the Diocesan Committee which scrutinizes applications for changes to church buildings. Often these churches are just names on a page, it's lovely to see the actual building depicted, not just a photograph but with the eye of an artist

In Hayley's little bio explaining her project, she guotes from Romans 12.6: 'We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us.' It's a short verse, but with profound implications: diversity – we have different gifts, interests, strengths and passions (no-one would follow a twitter account of my drawings!); generosity – God has given gifts to each one of us, none are left out; and, Paul goes on to say, responsibility – we are to use these gifts, not deny others or God the benefits that come from our unique contributions.

As a community, and as a Church, we need the full diversity of the gifts God gives. We need to be as generous in our sharing of them as God is in his giving of them. And in the use of them – as in Hayley's use of her gift - we find beauty, insight and joy.



#### **VILLAGE HALL NEWS**

September 2022

Toby Manning, Village Hall Committee Chairman

Everyone will be aware of the massive predicted increase in fuel prices – and the Village Hall is not immune. Currently we spend about £2,500 on gas and electricity every year – and this is predicted to increase to £11,000 (as a non-domestic user we are not subject to the price cap).

Our total costs are predicted to increase by 60%.

The Village Hall Committee has discussed this problem and we are taking a number of steps, including:-

- Installation of a remote-controlled heating control system to permit better control
- More specific fund-raising events (coffee and cake have offered to provide refreshments at the Scarecrow weekend, proceeds to the Village Hall)
- More marketing of the Hall
- Some price increases.

We will keep our financial position under close review: we do have significant reserves but these are needed in case we have to undertake major repairs to the building (our lease states that we are responsible for this).

We have ruled out a number of other options for the time being, including the installation of solar panels (our lease has only 7 years left to run).

You may be aware that our Parish Clerk, Hannah Shaw, has taken over responsibility for Hall Bookings from Margaret Bloor, and Hannah has some significant ideas about increasing our marketing for events such as childrens' parties. Margaret will continue to be involved in the bookings process, assisting Hannah, and we thank her for undertaking this important job for the last half year.

Markfield Lane and Groby Lane verges – help needed with conservation work In September, we'll be carrying out end of season conservation work on the wildlife sections of these two verges. This involves



cutting the grass, waiting a few days for the wildflower seeds to drop on to the ground, and then raking up the resulting hay (or arisings); wildflowers flourish in soil that's not rich in nutrients which is why the arisings are cleared away.

Even if you could join us for a half an hour or so, we'd be really grateful. The sessions are good fun (as well as being good exercise!). If you think you might be interested, please get in touch for more information. Also,

please let us know if you think you could make use of the hay.

#### Himalayan Balsam-pulling

"Many thanks to all the enthusiastic volunteers who helped to pull Himalayan Balsam to prevent the spread of this invasive plant. Several sessions were held in July and one in August at various locations. We were delighted that our efforts last year at several sites were rewarded by significantly reduced regrowth, proving it to be a worthwhile exercise. The photos show some of the team at work."





tance from Peter Williams of Leicestershire and Rutland Ornithological Society, and Jools Partridge of the Leicestershire and Rutland Bat Group. Siting of the owl and bat boxes needed a careful and informed selection of suitable locations, and the work involved had the safety (and insurance) implications of working fairly high up in trees.

Bat boxes were sited at all three areas maintained by the Parish Council – cemetery, Bob Bown Field and churchyard; a Barn Owl box was installed in a hedgerow tree at the cemetery, and a Tawny Owl box on one of the trees in the Bob Bown Field.

The photos show installation of the Barn Owl box, and one of the bat boxes at Bob Bown. We're hoping that all the wildlife boxes will be put to good use, and were delighted that at least three of the bird boxes were occupied this year. In each case, adult blue tits were seen going in and out of the box, feeding the chicks.






#### The Toposcope





In 1954 plans were being made for what was then called an Indicating Dial to be placed at "the \*highest vantage point in Leicestershire "close to Old John in Bradgate Park. The money for the project came from the funds raised by the Lady Jane Pageant in appreciation of the use of the Park. A design was prepared see opposite

page and on 10<sup>th</sup> July 1955 the Toposcope was unveiled and was described as a beautiful piece of modern craftsmanship in bronze. Sir Robert Martin invited the Chair of the Parish Council Mrs Connie Stopper to perform the ceremony. The final design differs slightly from the original plan shown. The wording along the edge reads "This indicator was given by the people of Newtown Linford from the proceeds of the





pageant of Lady Jane Grey held in the ruins 1951-1952".

#### Newtown Linford Village WhatsApp group

A while ago we brought up in the Magazine the idea of a village WhatsApp group - an idea that originated from one Hannah set up at the start of the COVID-19 epidemic called Community Action Response. There was then very little interest in it, but since then, our community WhatsAp group has expanded from the original members who picked up prescriptions, groceries etc to other villagers who find it useful to share information or who are looking for information. It was especially useful when we had the fires in the fields. If you would like to join contact Hannah to be included.

#### Information from David Snartt.

#### Planning Application.

I have submitted further representations to Charnwood Borough Council about the proposal to develop up to 150 dwellings on land adjacent to Markfield Lane, Newtown Linford. This information outlining two previous planning application decisions which were close to this proposed site. One refused by Charnwood Borough Council, the other granted planning permission by Charnwood Borough Council but refused by Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council.

The first, P/18/0848/2, refused by Charnwood Borough Council. The proposal for the erection of one bungalow adjacent to the current planning application site. The officer report stated: 'It is considered that the principle of a new dwelling at this site would have an unacceptable impact on the existing character of the area and the visual amenity of the surrounding open countryside. It is therefore considered that the development fails to comply with the provisions of policies CS2, CS11, EV/1 the NPPF and the SPD in this regard'.

This open countryside is the site for the latest planning application P/22/1031/2. In my view, this demonstrates that severe and demonstrable harms would occur if this latest planning application was approved on this site of open countryside.

The second application I referred to was the proposal to develop up to 93 dwellings on land north east of Ashby Road within the Newtown Linford Parish, but the access to the site is within Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council area. Therefore, it was determined by both Councils. After taking legal advice Hinckley and Bosworth refused this planning application. Stating: 'The proposal would have a significant adverse effect upon the intrinsic character and beauty of the countryside'.

In my view, this again demonstrates the negative impact on the open countryside that would occur, if this latest planning application for up to 150 dwellings was approved on the site adjacent to Markfield Lane, especially in this part of the Charnwood Forest area. To see my submissions and 'call in' please go to the Charnwood Borough Council website, planning application P/22/1031/2.

This application is still in the validation stage, although a case officer has now been appointed. I will keep you informed whilst this application is going through the planning process, I understand this application will soon be registered and be out to public consultation.

#### Charnwood Draft Local Plan.

Just a quick update on the Charnwood Draft Local Plan. The Inspectors

started the Hearings and after the first three days adjourned the rest of the planned session days. During the Hearing session on 28<sup>th</sup> June Charnwood Borough Council confirmed that it would, in principle, be willing to accommodate Charnwood's apportionment of Leicester's unmet housing need. As this represents a significant change in circumstances compared with the submitted Plan, which proposed that unmet need would be dealt with through a Plan review, further consideration is being given to how evidence for the apportionment can be tested and the progression of the Plan Examination overall.

The Inspectors have now contacted the Council with their suggested way forward. Within their letter they state: 'A pause in the current Examination is therefore essential to enable all interested parties to review and have an opportunity to comment on the evidence that underpins the apportionment for housing and for us to be able to test that evidence in a measured and robust way'. The Inspectors also suggest potential dates for the session on unmet need during the week commencing 16<sup>th</sup> October or 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2022.

In my view, this is disappointing news. Any delay in agreeing the Local Plan through Examination leaves the Council open to more piecemeal development because the Council cannot demonstrate a five year housing land supply.

#### The Loughborough Building Society.

After the most difficult times I experienced with the Nationwide Building Society when trying to save the closure of their Anstey Branch. The Deputy Mayor of Charnwood cut the ribbon, saying "as one door closes, another opens" and welcomed the Society to the community.

## This month's update comes from our colleagues at Action Fraud: WhatsApp scam costs victims £1.5 million

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) is warning the public about the continued increase in reports about scams where victims are targeted on WhatsApp by criminals pretending to be someone they know – typically their children.

Between 3rd February 2022 and 21st June 2022, there have been a total of 1235 reports made to Action Fraud linked to this scam, with total reported losses exceeding £1.5mn.

Criminals will usually begin the conversation with "Hello Mum" or "Hello Dad" and will say that they are texting from a new mobile number as their phone was lost or damaged. They will then ask for money to purchase a new one, or claim that they need money urgently to pay a bill

The criminal will provide bank details for the payment to be made to, with some coming back with further demands for money.

Detective Chief Inspector Craig Mullish, from the City of London Police, said: "If you receive a message like this from a friend or family member, don't send any money until you've had a chance to call them and confirm their identity. Taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe."

#### How to protect yourself:

STOP. THINK. CALL. If a family member or friend makes an unusual request on WhatsApp, always call the person to confirm their identity.

You can report spam messages or block a sender within WhatsApp. Press and hold on the message bubble, select 'Report' and then follow the instructions.

Never share your account's activation code (that's the 6 digit code you receive via SMS).
