In what, or whom, do we trust?

oday, as the media would have us believe, we are living in very difficult times. Huge cash injections are taking place around the developed world in order to maintain the banking system. We hear everyday of jobs being lost, companies closing their doors, houses being re-possessed and so on. The list is seemingly endless and the impact ever wider. Governments around the world are taking action, pushing money into a system that appears to be close to breakdown, trying to keep the flow of money to those who need it in place. People are being encouraged to tighten belts, to control spending, yet at the same time interest rates are being lowered in order to encourage spending – confused?

In what, or whom, do we as Christians trust? Where do we put our faith, our hope? Certainly not into money, or banks, or other institutions; we may use these organisations, may work for them, but our trust, our hope and our faith lies elsewhere.

As Christians, we have come into a relationship with Jesus, the Son of God. He announced himself as "The way, the truth and the life". We have entered into a new relationship with God through the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus, His Son.

As I write this article, we are half way through Epiphany with its focus of discovering more of God's Glory as seen through the life and ministry of Jesus. We have been aided in this through our various bible read-

ings which have included the visit of the Kings, Jesus' baptism, the calling of the first disciples, the miracle at the wedding in Cana, and the presentation of Jesus in the temple. In a few weeks time we will begin together the journey towards the events of Holy Week by marking the period of Lent in our worship as well as in our own personal devotion. But where does this take us in terms of our sense of Christian Trust?

We do not escape the problems and issues facing our world today just because we profess a faith in Jesus. However, our response can be different to these events as we have placed our faith in a loving God that only ever has our best interests at heart, even if we can't see or understand it at the time. And just as the

financial world seeks to continually support itself through various intervention mechanisms, so we too need to ensure that we are also continually shoring up our faith and trust by adding into our well of understanding and belief. Epiphany, Lent and all the other special seasons in the Church Calendar give us such opportunities to do so; the only question that remains is whether we take advantage of them.

So, with the start of Lent just around the corner (22nd February) and the problems of our world unlikely to disappear overnight, what will you do over the next 40 (or 46 days if you count Sundays) to help you deepen your trust and so be better equipped to live with Jesus day in, day out, as The Way, The Truth and The Life?

The website, nhwo.co.uk, was launched on 14 December and we would like to stress that it is not supported by the Neighbourhood and Home Watch Network (NHWN) which is the official national body representing ALL Neighbourhood Watch members in England & Wales.

The site pitches to Neighbourhood Watch members to register their scheme to obtain membership resources. It sells a 'co-ordinators pack' at £39.99 which includes two street signs, stickers and a high visibility vest with Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator on the back.

As I am sure residents are aware our NHW scheme is part of the Parish Council and in turn part of the National Neighbourhood Watch

which is free to all members. Every house is automatically a member.

The eagle eyed amongst you will have noticed that all metal on the Sunday School has been treated with Smartwater and signs erected accordingly. The Church has been treated for several years now.

Whilst not Newtown, but not far away, we have a report of suspicious males in Rothley, around Grangefields Drive area. They were knocking doors offering a "free prize draw" but were thought to be very suspicious. Three white males, two 17-19 years, the other older. 5'7"-5'9" tall, nothing more given and no vehicle seen.



NEWTOWN LINFORD PARISH COUNCIL

Police: At the December meeting the Chairman welcomed P.C. Stephenson ('Ed'), who has taken the place of P.C. Rhodes. We know that he will give us all the support he can.

Village Hall: As lease holder the Parish Council is in the middle of negotiations with Everards Breweries, who have presented us with a revised level of rent, rather more than we had expected. No doubt a mutually acceptable figure will be arrived at.

Churchyard: A flowering Cherry Tree for the church-yard was very kindly donated. It was planted recently and is expected to flower this year. No doubt in time it will look as spectacular as the one it replaces.

Highways: County Council Highways Department tidied up around the notice board at the bottom of Markfield Lane. This is on the pavement level, not by the brook. The notice board was damaged whilst the work was being done, but by the time you read this, it will have been repaired. The Parish Councillors thought a show of primroses, cowslips and daffodils would be attractive in this

area. So, watch this space. Charnwood Cleansing Department did

a good job clearing leaves on the wide pavement leading from the corner of Groby Lane to the School. They promised to keep an eye on this particular stretch, as it is much used by parents and children. You may have seen three posts in the pavement opposite Marion's Cottage. They were placed there by Highways to keep pedestrians safe from cars coming down the hill. We have been told that the posts are not quite in the right place. This will be checked. If you want to comment, please let me know. You may have seen the removal of a number of trees in the small wood on Markfield Lane. Unfortunately, despite efforts from Charnwood Borough Council, this could not be stopped as the applicant's appeal was upheld. However, this does not mean that any kind of development will be automatically permitted.

Planning: The Parish Council was consulted on a number of planning applications. Mostly they were for extensions (large and small) and tree work. Brief details are always listed in the Minutes. More detailed information can be obtained from the Planning Authority at Loughborough. I should emphasise that the Parish Council is only consulted, the final decision rests with the Charnwood Borough Council Planning i.e. the Planning Authority.

Determination of Precept for 2012/2013: Thanks to prudent 'housekeeping' the Parish Council has been able to keep the precept at £38,000 for the seventh year. It is possible, of course, that Council Tax will change because of requirements by the County Council and Charnwood Borough Council, in other words because of increases over which we have no control.

Next Parish Council meeting: Monday 20th February 2012 at 7 pm in the Village Hall. Visitors are always welcome.
