Passing on the baton of faith

I wonder if you've been watching the progress of the Olympic Torch around the British Isles on TV? Each day, come sunshine or rain, people have been carrying the lit torch and either receiving or handing on the flame as it travels through the country. Its purpose is to let as many people as possible see the flame and be aware that the Olympic Games will soon be happening. By the time you read this the torch may have passed through Leicestershire (2nd and 3rd July).

But I also wonder if you knew there are other batons and lights travelling around Leicestershire and Rutland? In fact there are ten of them! At a service in the Cathedral last December, a baton and light holder was given to each of the ten Deaneries (ours is Sparkenhoe East). The Board of Education for the Diocese has presented these to each Deanery to be used by Schools and Churches in celebrating our shared learning.

Just as the Olympic torch symbolises working together to pass on the spirit of the games from its original starting point in Greece, the passing on of our baton and light symbolises our working together as Christians in the passing on of faith. For thousands of years faith in God has been passed from one generation to another, to receive, develop, live by and hand on as an inheritance to the next generation.

We may not see visible signs of this but we find the gift of faith in other ways. As we read the Old Testament we learn how the love of God for his people kept and sustained them during the times when they obeyed his commands and the times when they didn't!

We do not know exactly who built our Church, nevertheless it has stood as a witness to our Christian faith for centuries. It has been kept, used and has been passed on to us to care for and hand on to those who come after us.

As we live our lives, each one of us can be a shining example of the love of God to be seen by those around us. Our light shines from what we do and say and, in small ways, is passed to those with whom we come into contact day by day. We are runners in a different but more important ³ race and it is how we run that race which will have a lasting effect

"I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."




Scarecrows weekend 29th/30th September 2012

From the Records

Water, water everywhere and not a drop to drink!

We have heard a lot about water recently. We all know about the amount of rain we have had and how many reservoirs are full. Unfortunately the ground water level is still low because of two dry winters and a summer. This has resulted in the fact that they have not lifted all the hosepipe bans. Severn Trent has stated that installing water meters in all the properties will not prevent drought conditions. Eventually they want water meters to be the norm. We have been told that long term careful management of supplies of water by all is the answer. Severn Trent have a programme to deal with leaks and an education programme on how we might use our water carefully.

What prompted me to write this article is a newspaper cutting in the Village Records about the availability of Water Meters by Severn Trent in November 1981. They had 1500 inquiries and the first meter to be collected from the stores was by Mr Donald Maggs who lived in Grey Crescent. The advantage was a saving in the water bill. Up to then it had been based on the rateable value of the property. Mr Maggs was hoping to save about £144 in a year.

Severn Trent said the water supply charge and part of the sewage charge would be based on the meter reading. The rest of the sewage charge and the

environment services would continue to be based on the rateable value of the property.

My husband and I went ahead and had one installed when Severn Trent had a free offer and saved quite a few pounds on our bills.

It is especially helpful for those living alone with houses with high rateable values as the bills will drop. There are charts to calculate if you will save money be having a meter installed.



Newtown Speedwatch:-

Since the last issue we have been able to enter the first stage to trial the Community Speedwatch. So far we have 10 volunteers willing to hold the gun plus our Police Beat Team who have said they will attend when on duty (*this gives the scheme a good boost*) We need 175 residents to sign the pledge that they would like the scheme. We can accept signatures electronically so if you have been sent the form and not sent it back, please do so as soon as possible.

Brief details of the scheme.

31 Volunteers will monitor speeds in accordance with the Chief Police

Officers guidelines of 10% + 2mpg e.g. 35 mph and above in a 30 mph limit.

The Police will retain the right to maintain control over the number of letters sent out.

Volunteers will work in pairs and keep a log of the offending vehicles. This log will be passed to the Police who will send out warning letters to registered keepers.

The Police will target persistent offenders for future enforcement.

Volunteers must not attempt to stop cars or step into the road.

If approached by a driver they are to be handed a ready prepared letter.

Training in basic conflict resolution techniques will be provided. This will be for approximately two hours in the Sunday School the week prior to the speed gun being provided for a four week session.

There will be a number of copies of the pledge sheets around so if you would like to pledge your support and/or volunteer please only sign on one sheet. Please email me as well if you are prepared to be a volunteer. At the time of going to press I have just over 40 signatures. Not sure about anyone else.

It would be appreciated if you can go to the sheet rather than Lydia and I having to do too much foot work knocking doors.

Annual Meeting of the Parish: This took place on Monday 28th May 2012 at 7 pm in the Village Hall. This meeting acts as an overview of what has happened in the past year.

Chairman's Report: The Chairman, Mr. Ken Waterfall thanked the Parish Councillors and other associates of the Council for all their efforts. These included attending meetings (and providing reports where necessary) at the Borough and County Councils, Police Authority, Road Safety Committees, Quarry and Landfill Committees, Neighbourhood Watch liaison, Plaving field inspections, Planning Consultations, Website Management, Village Hall, Village Magazine input and contributions, planting of planters, hanging baskets, Tree and Heritage Warden duties, churchvard and cemetery maintenance. He extended a special thankyou to P.C. Ed Stephenson (our new 'Bobby') and his P.C.S.O. Alex Beirne for their regular input to us and for working with Mrs. Pam McMorran, our Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator. Together they do a great job and keep us well informed and aware of potential hazards. The Police's use of the Sunday School is still working well, and we are pleased to see a Police presence in the Village. He thanked the Clerk for the efficient and clear presentation of the Accounts year ending 31st March 2012. The precept has been held at £38,000 for the seventh year, which is excellent in these times of continuing inflation. Ongoing projects include additional equipment for the playing field to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee, and the extension of the cemetery. The Chairman thanked Borough and County Councillor, Mr. David Snartt for all his guidance, support and advice and for the efficient way he deals with our gueries. Police Report: P.C. Stephenson presented a detailed comparison of crime, April to April, within the Parish, for 2010/2011 and 2011/2012, which showed an overall decrease, but particularly for thefts from motor vehicles which had dropped from 17 to 5. Speeding has been made a

Beat Priority for Newtown Linford. More details will be made available in the Neighbourhood Watch section in the Magazine.

Village Hall Report: Mr. Michael Upstone made a comprehensive report covering all aspects of the Village Hall and its running. He thanked too many people to mention here, but he made it clear that the Village Hall could not function without them. If you would like a copy of the report, please let me know.

Clerk's Report: As Clerk I prepare minutes, notices, reports and preparatory work for 13 weeks each year. As Registrar of Burials I prepare

³⁵ deeds and records for graves, ashes plots and monuments. I liaise with families of the deceased, Funeral Directors, and Stonemasons. I mark plots for burials and stay in contact with our grounds maintenance team and the gravedigger. As Responsible Financial Officer I deal with all aspects of the Parish Council's finances, including the Annual Accounts, which have to be approved by the Parish Councillors, our Internal Auditor and the External Auditors. I want to thank the Chairman, the Vice -Chairman, the Parish Councillors and our Borough and County Councillor, for their courtesy, advice, help and support.

Accounts 2011/2012: These were studied, discussed and approved. A very satisfactory balance of over \pounds 50,000 will be carried over to the next financial year, thanks to carefully budgeting by the Parish Council. The Chairman thanked the Clerk for the clear presentation of the accounts.

That ended the Annual Meeting of the Parish. The **Annual Parish Council Meeting** followed on immediately. The main purpose of this annual meeting is the election of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman for the ensuing year. Mr. Ken Waterfall was nominated, seconded and duly elected as the Chairman, there not being any other nominations. Mrs. Janet Neaverson was nominated, seconded and duly elected as the Vice -Chairman, there not being any other nominations. The Chairman signed the 'Declaration of Acceptance of Office'. 
