On What Ground?

When I walked, last year, up Mount Sinai (known as 'Mount Moses' to the Egyptians, and 'Mount Horeb' to Bible readers), it wasn't a solo pilgrimage experience. I shared the path with 200+ others. Some of them were tourists; you could tell by their chatter and what they photographed. Some were clearly religious; you could tell by their clothes and the songs they sang. Some weren't religious but wanted to experience something spiritual, to experience holy ground here on this mountain.

But given that we don't spend most of our time on Sinai, where do we discover the sacred? In a Church, maybe. Possibly in the places of pilgrimage. Or surely among a community of people who are committed to care, encourage, support and enable each other. Earlier this week, I came across the following notes which had been made in the margins of medieval manuscripts. They had been written by the Christian monks whose task it was to scribe the books between their daily gatherings for prayer¹. They clearly didn't find their work or environment particularly holy at times!

- *New parchment, bad ink; I say nothing more.*
- *I am very cold.*
- *Let the reader's voice honour the writer's pen*
- *The ink is thin.*
- *Thank God it will soon be dark.*
- *Writing is excessive drudgery. It crooks your back, it dims your sight, it twists your stomach and your sides.*
- *St. Patrick of Armagh, deliver me from writing.*
- *While I wrote I froze, and what I could not write by the beams of*
3 *the sun I finished by candlelight.*

- *As the harbour is welcome to the sailor, so is the last line to the scribe.*
- *This is sad! O little book! The day will come in truth when someone over your page will say "The hand that wrote it is no more."*

So finding the holy clearly isn't about having the label of being a holy person, or being in a holy environment, or walking up a holy mountain. It's much more about noticing that God is present, sometimes most unexpectedly.

I was in primary school yesterday, with each class in turn, after hearing that one of their school mates had died in an accident. In each class we talked about what this shocking news feels like, what we do now, what happens to his named tray with all its contents (including a few very old, uneaten jelly beans), what happens when we die, what we think about it all, what we have lost and what we still have..... as they talked I found we were on holy ground. There was nothing to see or measure, just a pocket of time when our talk was expansive and sacred.

Finding holy ground requires no equipment or special clothes, you don't have to pay any fees, hire a personal trainer or have a map. It may require a different pace and usually those who find holy ground are prepared to linger instead of charging on.

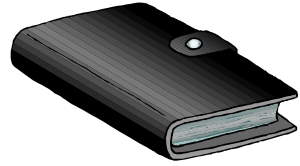
My experience is that the God who makes ground holy isn't as interested in religion as he is in humanity. That is why Jesus was happy to join humanity and take on real flesh and blood. He spent much of his influential life and death not with the religious but the rest of the population. Read the gospels and you will find Jesus, again and again, discovering holy ground and conversations of faith in the most surprising of situations. I don't think much has changed and I discover I am often asking, 'On what ground am I standing here?'

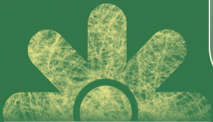

We had visits from experts who have a national status in their chosen field and some whose work has been featured on Gardeners' World. Last month we had a fascinating talk on gardens in Palm Springs, California and how they all cope on the edge of a desert at the foot of a mountain range. It made the little bit of clay we have to deal with seem somewhat unimportant.



From the Records

Our Churchyard

During the life of Newtown Linford WI, the Members participated in many of the County competitions and surveys, including the Field Name and Use Surveys. These Parish Surveys were repeated many years later showing the changes in the use of the land. One year we recorded all the plants in the Churchyard. Another highlight was a special scrapbook for a special WI year. A very thorough survey was undertaken when we agreed to record, measure and draw all the gravestones in the Churchyard. This and other surveys are in the local record office.

Mr Tommy Thompson, the husband of Lucile Thompson who was a WI member went deeper into the project and went ahead and sorted all those who were buried in to the churchyard (500). He followed the

chronological record of all the deaths in the village since 1616 (when records were first recorded). He then went onto link them with the headstones, difficult because they had been moved since Basil Gimson recorded their position in 1949.

The book of Tommy Thompson's records and drawings of each headstone are in the Church for all to see.

It is worth walking around the Churchyard to discover the different types of headstones - Swithland slate; stone; granite; cast iron and one war grave memorial. The inscriptions also vary and include one Richard Austin a benefactor who gave a bequest of £5 to the poor. In 1710 that was a lot of money.

One headstone is now in the Church for safekeeping. It is thought it was an apprentice piece and the person who purchased it could not afford a special headstone - the piece of Swithland slate bears the letters of the alphabet and numerals.

The headstone for Mr Boney who died in 1683 records that he had "five wife's". There are those which tell of the families that lived here would they recognise the village if they returned today?

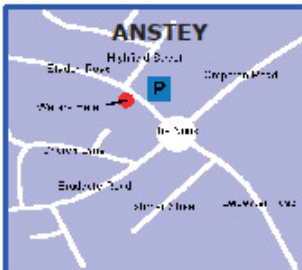

Newtown Linford Neighbourhood Watch - A member of the Parish Council



A resident reported a teenage boy on a bike, not believed to be local, handing small packages to two much younger boys also on bikes in Grey Crescent. Please keep a look out as it sounds suspicious.

A taxi driver reports dropping someone on Main Street near the School in the early hours and payment being refused.

The latest fraud is: You could receive one or two new mobile phones and later a call from someone saying they are the company that wrongly sent them out and they will call and collect them. This is not the way mobile phone companies work. They always send a reply paid envelope for them to be sent back. These are people using your name and address to acquire the phones.

Web fraud: More reports of our members having their Address book being compromised. It makes their computer send out an email to everyone in their address book – often says they are stranded abroad due to illness and need money quick. Looks genuine and you panic for your friend but stop and think before acting = thousands of pounds have been stolen this way. Another variation tells you of this scam and to warn everyone in your address book. Even better, you are doing the work for them!! The object of the latter is intended to slow down the web by hundreds of people sending out emails to their entire address book at the same time.

Telephone fraud: Someone claiming to be the UK Claim Line based in London acting on behalf of those mis-sold PPI payments. They ask for an administration fee up front by the end of the day on the promise of securing thousands of pounds in return.

I am told that Insurance premiums have gone up considerably for those who have received a speeding fine so watch out. P.C. Ed Stephenson and P.C.S.O Alex Beirne are out and about.

Hopefully by the time you are reading this the yellow lines will be reinstated on the Main Street. It has been chaos and virtually everyone parking knows full well that there should be yellow lines there. As I write this the barrier is being removed at the end of Markfield Lane. The residents can settle down to normal life again. That's the good news, the bad is that Severn Trent will be installing new pipes the entire length of

31 Main Street and Groby Lane in October. They will not need to close

the road as it will be dealt with by traffic lights in sections. It does mean they will be digging up that nice new top dressing the Leics. County Council has spread this week. I drove at less than 10 miles per hour but alas a driver the other way did not resulting in me having a cracked screen.

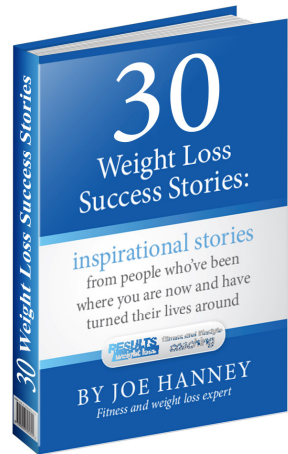
