

There were ten of us on the February walk. It was a beautiful, crystal clear sunny afternoon, snowy and icy underfoot, so we had to walk gingerly at times. However, the distant views more than compensated for this. From the Village Hall we went along to Markfield Lane, across the fields and past Johns Lee Wood towards Markfield. At the A50 we turned right and followed the footpath to Lea Lane. Then we continued on down to Polly Botts Lane. At Lea Meadows Nature Reserve, we paused for a few minutes for a potted history of the area.

Lea Meadows, owned by the Leicestershire and Rutland Wildlife Trust, was originally a medieval assart (an area of private farmland formed out of communal land – Lea Wood being the other part). It was first mentioned in a document of 1287. To keep out forest animals such as deer, the farmers made a substantial bank and ditch around the assart, remnants of which can still be found along its eastern boundary. Near the entrance from Polly Botts Lane were a few houses and fenced enclosures for cattle and pigs, evidence for which can still be seen on the ground as irregular shallow depressions and slightly elevated mounds.

The Lea Assart was retained by the Manor of Groby and not granted to Ulverscroft Priory, as was much land in the area. The manorial land later became known as the Bradgate Estate which was sold off by auction in 1925. Lea Meadows then became part of Blakeshay Farm. When this in turn was sold in 1986, the Trust purchased Lea Meadows as a nature reserve.

After crossing the meadows we wandered back along the valley to Newtown, finishing at 25, Markfield Lane for tea and cakes. Claire Costello





Road Closures.

I received several complaints about the signage that was installed and communication with business and residents whilst Sharpley Hill was closed to traffic. This was to allow Severn Trent to complete much needed work along this stretch of road.

Once this is completed work will transfer to Markfield Lane. I attended a meeting with Severn Trent and their contractors to put these points over, especially as many more residents live on

Markfield Lane and it is a main route for local residents to access the M1. I was assured that communication links will be in place to try and reduce the impact of this necessary work which will take around eight weeks to complete. Please let me know if you are experiencing any difficulties.

Looking ahead, Main Street in Swithland will be closed for a few weeks during the summer whilst flood alleviation work is carried out, this will include installing a new culvert under Main Street along with re-shaping the road and verge immediately above the new culvert, with a view to getting the excess water off the carriageway into the brook.

Tell Us Once Service.

Recently a new service was set up to simplify the process for members of the public to inform central and local government agencies about a person's death. At this stressful time, in the past people who register a person's death are required individually to inform a wide range of Government bodies. 



Newtown Linford Neighbourhood Watch - A member of the Parish Council



As you may have read in the local press, the Leicestershire Police Authority will be abolished in November of this year. Parish Councillor Dr. Richard Lowe attended a briefing meeting in Loughborough and I sent a copy of the presentation from that meeting out to all those on the email list. I also sent out a copy of the Charnwood Local Policing Unit update from Inspector Duncan Southall. I will put links to both of these on the Parish Council website.

P.C. Ed Stephenson said on the 11th February that there had been 56 burglaries at dwellings on his beat since the 1st January as opposed to 20 in the same period last year. Most of them were at Rothley, Cropston and Thurcaston but several have been here in Newtown. Whilst a lot of crimes are considerably down in Leicestershire they are not the type of crime we get here anyway. The increase in house burglary which is personally invasive is most disturbing especially in the light of the changes predicted for the Police in their presentation.

During the last month those on the email list also received a survey to be completed with their preferences about the loss of Police Officers against the increase in Council Tax. As someone pointed out to me this appears to be blackmail.

Matters reported recently:-

- A male knocking doors after dark selling pictures. ID card stating them to be deaf. This had already cropped up in Woodhouse and Woodhouse Eaves and their Parish Clerk had asked Councillor David Snartt to make enquiries about it as their permission had been given by Nottinghamshire Police and not Leicestershire Police. We have now asked Newtown to be added to the complaints.
- Diesel has been stolen on two occasions from the Seven Trent excavating equipment on Sharpley Hill. This equipment is due to be moved as I write to Markfield Lane so residents please keep your eyes and ears open.
- Nottinghamshire Trading Standards reported cold callers claiming to fit free or cheap burglar alarm systems. No reports in this area yet.
- The Motor Insurers Group issued Reports of a company by the name of Aston Midshires Insurance issuing invalid Insurance Certificates.
- (lower end Main Street) Attempted break in of a garden shed causing
- 35 damage but nothing taken.

- Markfield Lane. Front door kicked in at 4.05 in the afternoon making considerable noise. One resident had just backed out of drive and it is believed the culprit thought the house was empty. When realizing the house was still occupied he made a get away with accomplice on moped/scooter. Both wore crash helmets. Since it was spontaneous and noisy it is possible they were affected by drugs.
- Yellow pick up van with two men with soft Irish accents on Ulverscroft Lane claiming to be looking for scrap. Reg number FP 54 LLO. No crime committed at that time.
- Crime of a different nature. Large piles of dog excrement are again being left on the pavement all the way from Grey Crescent to the park gates. Obviously a large dog which cannot manage to walk all the way to the park. If the owner paid the park fee then the dog may manage to put its deposit in the park!! Would they clear it up then? If you spot the culprit, please let us have the car number.

Thanks to all those residents who have contacted me this month on all sorts of matters that have caused irritation. I will continue to point you in the right direction. Neighbourhood Watch is all about helping each other to live together in harmony and not just crime statistics.

However, I hope that you are all as keen on preserving trees and new tree plantings as I am. Dr. Lowe, who is one of our Parish Councillors and also our Tree Warden. has been negotiating with Leicestershire County Council for replacement trees along the Park wall on Bradgate Road where a number of Hawthorn trees had to be removed sometime ago because they carried a disease. Leics. County Council agreed that some new trees should be planted, and in addition offered more trees for other locations: Sharpley Hill, near the layby is to receive up to three oaks and Markfield's lower service road will have an addition of probably 2 trees, a mix of rowan, oak, or birch.


